Matthew 18.21-35 There is no way to measure the extent of God's generosity in forgiving. 'Seventy-seven times' doesn't say it and neither does 'ten thousand talents'. Human forgiveness is rooted in divine forgiveness and to be forgiven means giving up the power-play of innocent versus guilty and joining a fellowship of forgiven sinners.
