Genesis 14.17-20 In Christian tradition these verses have played an important role as the bread and wine (noted in v18) have been seen as prefiguring the Eucharistic elements.

Revelation 19.6-10 The vision of John has unfolded with three great cycles of disaster and now God's judgement is celebrated and a new age anticipated in a great Hallelujah chorus.

John 2.1-11 John calls the great actions of Jesus 'signs' (not miracles), thereby directing our attention to their inner meaning. Jesus' action at Cana is the first of the signs with the Passion being seen as the greatest. The story actually contains the whole Gospel message.
